# Founder Message

Dear Friends and Partners,  
As we reflect on 2025, I am filled with deep gratitude and renewed hope. This past year marked a season of transition and refinement for ALDN. We experienced significant leadership change with the departure of two key in-country leaders, OB and Jolly, who faithfully served ALDN and helped shape this movement in meaningful ways. Their contributions have a left lasting imprint on our team and wider ecosystem, and we remain thankful for their obedience and partnership in this chapter of our journey. At the same time, God graciously provided new leadership for the season ahead. In the first half of the year, we welcomed Tsomoo as Mercy Operations Director, strengthening Mercy Network's foundation. In the latter half, Hetay joined us as Senior Director, bringing clarity, structure, and renewed momentum to our ecosystem-building efforts. Their additions have been timely gifts, equipping us for sustainable growth.

This year, we also intentionally slowed our pace. Rather than doing more, we chose to focus on what matters most. We implemented ALDN's Impact Framework, prayerfully evaluated our programs, and made difficult but necessary decisions to discontinue activities that contributed less toward our long-term mission. This refinement allowed us to more fully live into our Core and Multiplier strategy, focusing on deep leader formation over broad activity alone.

One of the most meaningful outcomes of this shift was the launch of our Core and Multiplier Retreats. These gatherings became sacred spaces of spiritual, leadership, relational, and emotional renewal for leaders from both marketplace and ministry tracks. In a demanding season, God met our leaders with rest, clarity, and renewed calling. Beyond Mongolia, we are humbled to see how our faith-driven entrepreneurial ecosystem is now influencing others. The stories, playbooks, and lessons emerging from Unleash and our broader ecosystem are inspiring leaders in other frontier contexts—including Egypt and neighboring Central Asia countries—to begin activating and shaping their own entrepreneurial communities. What God is doing locally is now bearing fruit globally.

One of our most tangible milestones this year has been the Mercy Community Center. Phase 1 is now 85% complete, including the guest house restoration and the establishment of the new community center. This space will soon serve as a hub for mercy, leadership development, hospitality, and community transformation. We anticipate completion by early summer 2026, and we look forward to welcoming many of you there in the years ahead.

At ALDN, our vision has always been to see leaders, organizations, and communities transformed spiritually, economically, socially, and relationally. Despite staffing transitions, funding challenges, and ongoing uncertainties, we have clearly seen God at work in shaping leaders, renewing vision, and challenging hearts and minds toward greater faithfulness and impact. None of this would be possible without you. Thank you for standing with us through your prayers, generosity, time, talents, wisdom, and relationships. You are co-builders with us in laying Gospel infrastructure and cultivating lasting Kingdom transformation in Mongolia and beyond.

# Opportunity Remains



Freedom of religion was restored in Mongolia in 1991. Today approximately 40% of **3.4 million Mongolians** identify as non-religious, with most of the remaining population identifying as Buddhist. In 1989, there were only four known Mongolian Christians.

Since 1989, the Church has grown to an estimated 55,000 Mongolian believers, **still less than 2% of the population.** According to a 2020 survey, there are roughly 670 churches, with the average size being less than 50 people.

There are a handful of churches with 100 to 500 people. About 45% of all churches are in Ulaanbaatar, the capital city.

While this growth is encouraging, the number of Christians remains small. ALDN believes the **Gospel brings salvation and the power to transform Mongolian society across every sphere**—business, culture, government, family, and education. ALDN is dedicated to equipping leaders to drive Christ-centered change for the Kingdom of God in Mongolia.

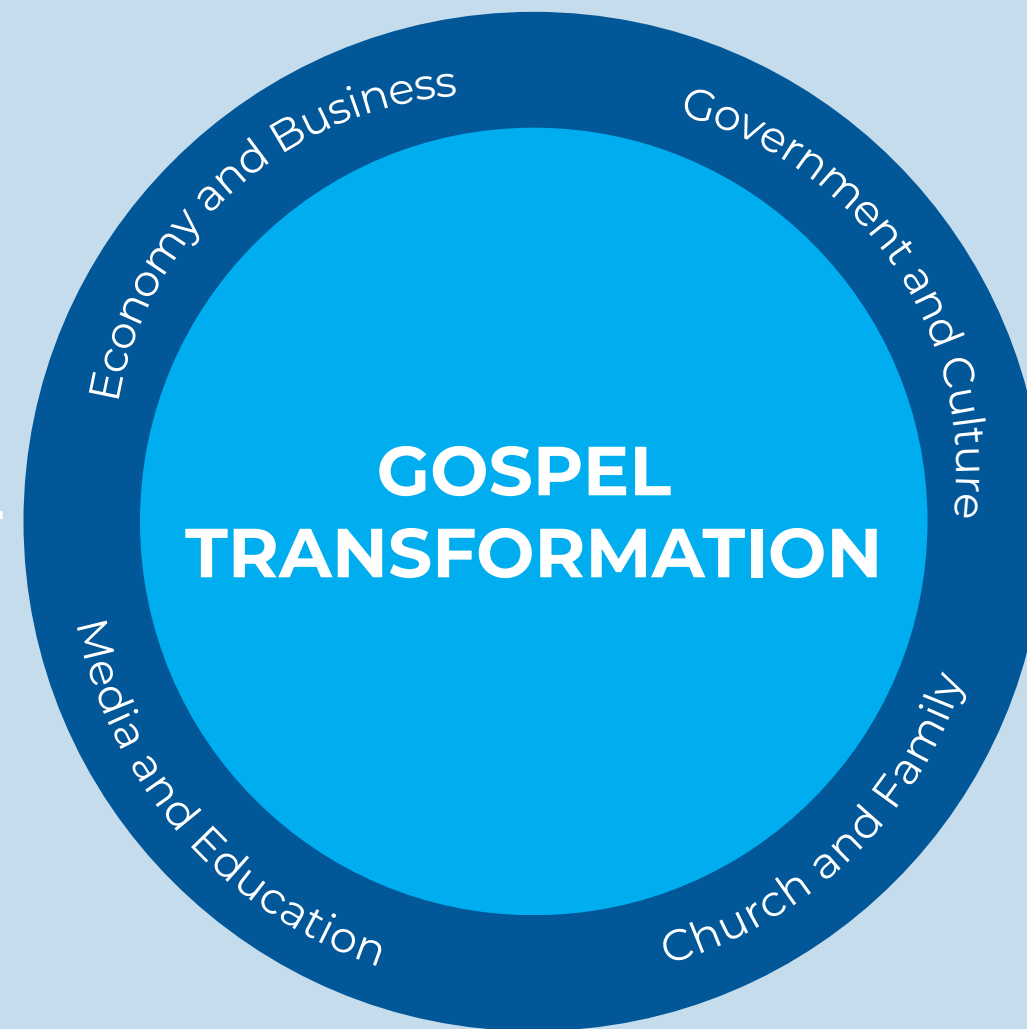

# ASPIRE for Christ

Aspire is an initiative designed to equip early stage entrepreneurs with practical business skills through networking, pitch competitions and hands-on workshops, all with the goal of launching Christ-centered business initiatives that bring hope and transformation to their communities. Aspire has help ideated 25 new entrepreneurs and a dozen of growth stage businesses received significant outside mentorship for growth. One alumni successfully received a loan from a global Kingdom-centered venture capital firm in 2025.

# Highlights of Our Leadership Formation

## Rest & Renewal Leadership Retreat

In 2025, ALDN hosted a retreat for **30 entrepreneurs, marketplace and NGO leaders** to take time to **rest, reflect, and spend time together** in meaningful connection for two days and two nights. This time was made possible thanks to the generosity of time from our partners in ministry who also acted as mentors to this group of people. We had Chick-Fil-A, Lifeshape foundation partners shared and taught key leadership topics that is relevant to our participants.

For a special Faith & Work 2025 initiative, ALDN partnered with the YouVersion Bible App to translate and **distribute 12 reading plans**, reaching **323 individuals based in 20 countries**. One key resource was the newly translated 3-day reading plan, “**Secrets to Growing Your Business,**” prepared by Munkhjargal, translator of Business Secrets in the Bible.

The Unleash Summit is the flagship event for ALDN, and is the largest gathering of faith-driven entrepreneurs and business leaders in Mongolia. 2025 marked 6 years of Unleash Summit, with this year's theme being "Built to Last."

Unleash Summit introduced the Start Up Pitch in 2025 with great excitement. Twelve business proposals were submitted prior to the event and three selected businesses pitched live on stage at the Unleash Summit. One start-up was awarded the grand prize: ₮5 million MNT (\$1,500 USD).

The grand prize was awarded to "Everyday Bakery," operated by Bayankhishig, a church leader who was began serving in Lün soum, Töv province, three years ago.

# Global Mentorship Forming Faithful Leaders



In its second year, the Global Mentorship Program, in partnership with Resource Global, continued to help young Christian professionals **trace God's fingerprints** in their lives, **understand their callings**, and **navigate workplace** as followers of Christ. The experience aims to **fill mentorship gaps** in Mongolia.

In 2025, the second cohort was supported by four facilitators - three returning from 2024 and a new facilitator who was previously a participant, combining **continuity and new perspective**.

Despite challenges in global coordination, the 18 individuals who finished the 7-month program gained cross-cultural and diverse relationships. Participants ranged from medicine and banking to nonprofit and technology. They demonstrated the **beauty of a global Christian community** seeking to honor God in their professional lives.

With thoughtful improvements and continued prayer, the next cohort has **strong potential to grow** in engagement, impact, and reach. This year serves as a reminder of how God uses simple rhythms of meeting, sharing, and learning to transform lives and callings.

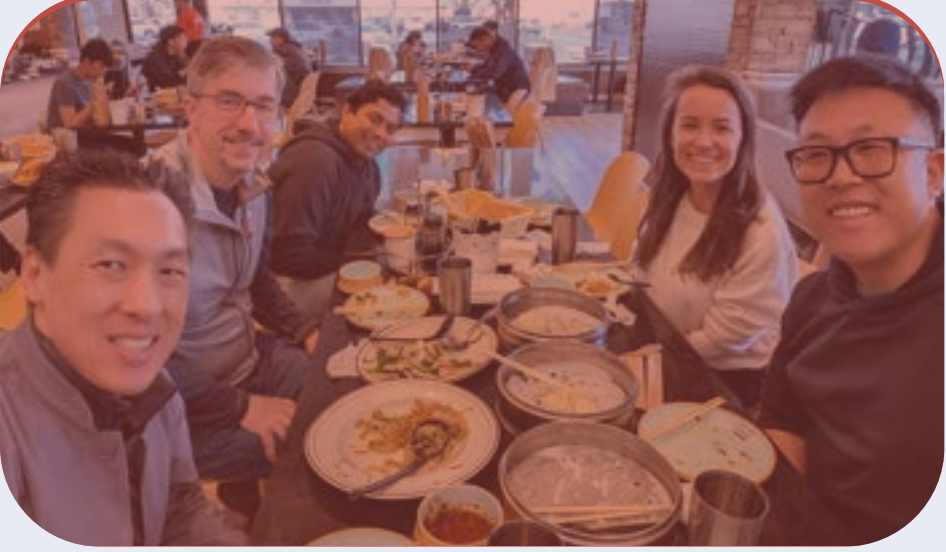

# Building a Place of Mercy

## The Mercy Center

### Flagship Milestone

2025 marked ALDN's biggest year yet for Mercy Network. By God's grace, ALDN officially broke ground on the Mercy Community Center (MCC).

The MCC establishes a **permanent, safe, and sustainable space** to serve vulnerable families in Ulaanbaatar's **underserved Ger districts**. Designed as a hub for community care, ministry, and social outreach, the MCC will strengthen Mercy Network's ability to **walk alongside families** with dignity, consistency, and hope.

In 2025, the project advanced from vision to reality through generous donor support, preparation, and infrastructure development.

Key planning, design, and site-readiness work took place to ensure its long-term sustainability, particularly within the unique challenges of the Ger district where centralized utilities are limited or absent.

After design, survey, and planning work, construction began in August 2025. By December, approximately 80% of the scope was completed. This included **major construction work on the new 400m<sup>2</sup> Mercy Center building and substantial renovation of the existing 180m<sup>2</sup> house on the property.**

At the heart of the center is a vision to foster connection and restoration through new spaces like the Mercy Café, the Mercy Guesthouse, the greenhouse, and recreation area.

They will provide rest and refuge for pastors and leaders and serve families through vital resources such as counseling, upskilling, and food distribution.

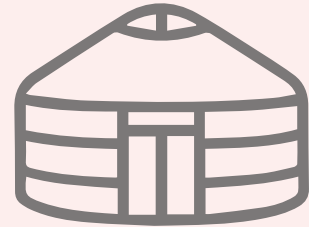
### Grand Opening in 2026

The focus now shifts to interior finishing, furnishing, outdoor landscaping and recreational development. The **Mercy Center is scheduled to begin serving the community in June 2026.**

What began as a vision is coming to life. It is rooted in Christ's love and generous support of donors, alongside hard work, perseverance, and a deep commitment to serve those most in need.

# Continuing the Care Meeting the Now

## For Families, Faith, and the Next Generation

Mercy Network continued to walk closely with families facing immediate hardship. Through food distribution and practical support, families received not only essential resources, but **consistent care rooted in dignity and relationship**.

In 2025, ALDN continued distributing school backpacks to children. ALDN equipped **94 children** to foster confidence and greater love for learning. Parents expressed gratitude as the assistance eased financial strain in their households.

ALDN began **new partnership with 5 local churches** to start libraries for spiritual growth. ALDN also **expanded the 13 church libraries** of existing partners. To further support pastors, ALDN hosted its **first pastors retreat for 20 pastors** to provide rest and renewal to serve those who are always serving.

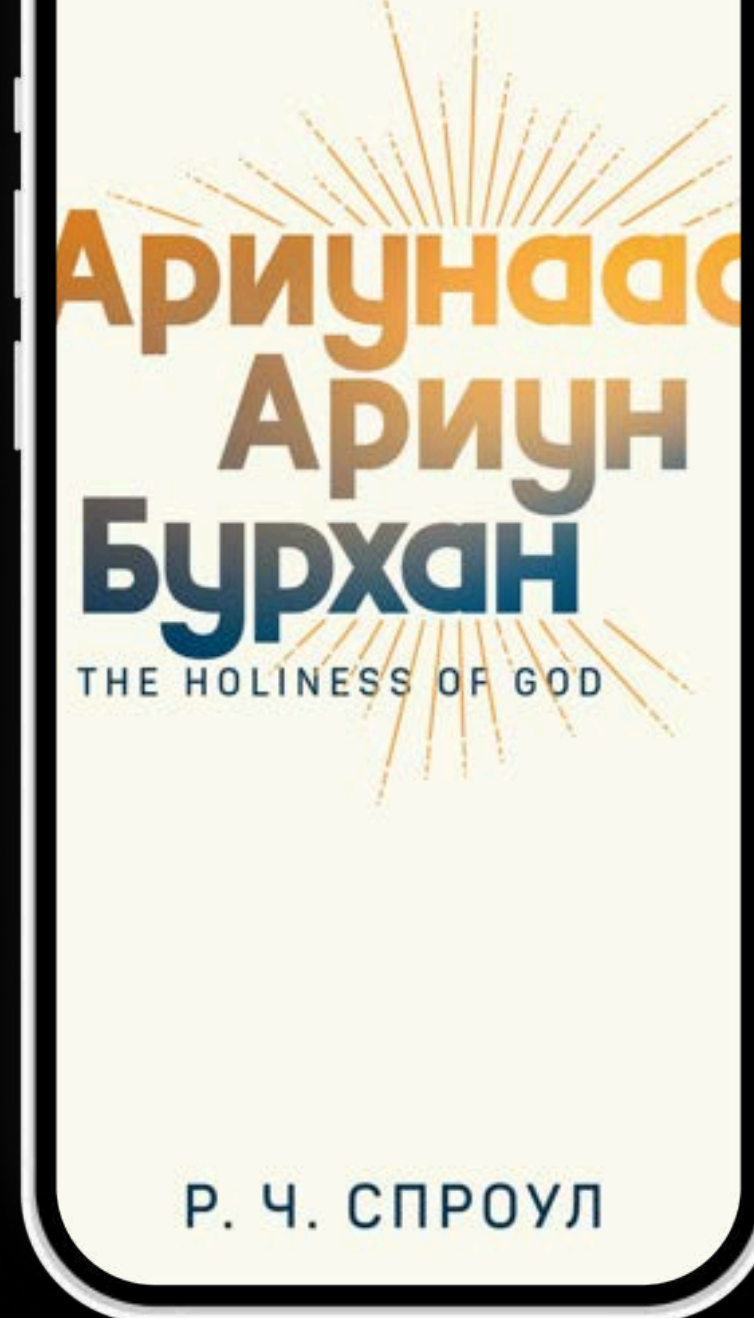
# Gerelt Publishing Shining Light

## Deepening Faith through Literature

Gerelt Publishing, in its third year, entered into new publishing agreements with leading organizations such as **Crossway**, **Tyndale Publishing**, and **9Marks** to further expand the catalog and strengthen its commitment to high-quality, Biblical literature. The year's best-selling title was *Don't Waste Your Life* by John Piper. Gerelt reached a significant milestone with digital and print publication of *The Holiness of God* by R.C. Sproul. Gerelt also printed *Solid Joys Devotional* by John Piper and digitally published *Deeper* by Dane Ortlund. Several additional titles completed or are ongoing in translation, editing, and licensing, positioning Gerelt for **continued growth in impact** in the years ahead.

As a Christian publisher, the foremost commitment is to accuracy, clarity, and faithfulness in translation. Gerelt currently works with **six skilled translators**, coaching them through collaborative projects in language, culture, and project management. By investing in their development, Gerelt ensures that each book **serves the Mongolian Church with integrity** while also **building a strong, sustainable team** for the future of Christian publishing in Mongolia.

# The Church in Mongolia: Key Challenges & Opportunities

**Major Challenges to Healthy Church Growth**

Christianity is often viewed as a foreign faith in Mongolia, leading to social resistance and hesitation from government officials to grant or renew church registrations. These barriers impact the legal stability and public presence of many congregations.

**Theological Vulnerability and the Influence of Cultic Groups**

Organized cultic groups are actively targeting Mongolian believers, exploiting limited theological grounding. This highlights the urgent need for accessible, biblically sound training and resources in the Mongolian language.

**Decline in Church Participation Post-COVID**

Prior to COVID-19, Mongolia had approximately 630 registered churches nationwide. Since then, church attendance declined by nearly 50% due to prolonged lockdowns and restrictions on gatherings, forcing some churches to close and leaving many—especially smaller congregations—struggling to regain participation and momentum.

**Leadership Fragility and Church Sustainability**

Over 80% of Mongolian churches have fewer than 50 members, placing significant financial, emotional, and relational strain on pastors, many of whom are bi-vocational and lack peer support, training, and mentorship. This challenges long-term church health and sustainability.

**Critical Need for Quality Theological and Discipleship Resources**

A significant shortage of high-quality Mongolian-language theological and discipleship resources limits effective discipleship, leadership development, and long-term church resilience across all levels of the church.

**Faith Integration, Economic Pressure, and Migration**

Many believers struggle to live out their faith beyond Sunday, limiting discipleship and cultural impact. Economic pressure and youth migration further weaken leadership continuity and restrict churches' ability to invest in training and next-generation leaders, especially in rural areas.

# The Church in Mongolia: ALDN's Response

**Unleash Academy & Faith and Work Initiative**

Through Unleash Academy and its Faith and Work initiative, ALDN equips entrepreneurs and young professionals to integrate faith into daily work, grow with biblical integrity, and build supportive networks. These strengthen the church's influence beyond Sunday gatherings.

**Church-Based Community Support and Pastoral Networks**

In partnership with local churches, ALDN supports vulnerable families and strengthens regional pastoral networks, fostering collaboration, encouragement, and shared learning while reducing pastoral isolation.

**Gerelt Publishing**

Gerelt Publishing meets the critical need for trusted Mongolian-language theological resources by translating and creating biblically sound content, distributed through multi-medium platforms to strengthen theological depth across the Church.

**Concluding Observations**

Despite ongoing challenges, the Mongolian church remains resilient and faithful. Sustained, strategic partnerships focused on theological depth, leadership development, whole-life discipleship, and post-pandemic recovery are essential for healthy, long-term growth in the years ahead.
